Founded in 1974, the Guild met nearly every week to learn new skills, socialize, and work on creative projects such as quilting, making cornhusk dolls, designing table arrangements, and much, much more.

The club's stated purpose was "to foster an appreciation of — and participation in — arts and crafts and to encourage and assist each member toward a proficiency in at least one field of endeavor, thus actively enriching the culture of the community."

The scrapbooks, which span from 1974 through 2023, are filled with programs, photographs, and treasured memorabilia that capture the Guild's rich legacy.
