'Empowering Women' project earns Barlow Brilliance Award

Hypes' "Strong Women – Stronger Marion: Enrichment Day 2024" was chosen for the 2023 "Ida Barlow Brilliance (\$1,000) Award."

"My hope is that participants will unlock new potential which will lead to stronger women, and a stronger Marion," Hypes explained.

The award recognizes a local woman entrepreneur or nonprofit leader whose *innovative program* benefits our community — while aligning with the Women's Club mission to empower women and enrich the community. Jer-Zee owner Barb Pine won the 2022 award for her "Story Time" program designed to improve literacy rates.

"Strong Women — Stronger Marion" is designed to give participants opportunities to explore new skills and make connections with others.
